Wakamow Valley is an urban natural park with over 20km of trails and almost 500 acres of parkland.

Located in the heart of Moose Jaw just minutes from the historic downtown area. the valley offers a peaceful haven **WELCOME** for locals and visitors alike.

There are a vast number of recreational activities to enjoy in Wakamow Valley for every season.

The trails are open year round and the valley is home to a wide variety of flora and fauna.

In addition to the trails, there are four playgrounds. four public pavilions, an ecological zone with four distinct ecosystems, a campground and the ever-popular Burger Cabin.

RE-THINK ACTIVITY

Wakamow Valley is more than just a park. There are so many activities for all ages and abilities. Improve your physical and mental well-being by enjoying some of the following activities:

Walk, Jog, Run, Cycle

There are more than 20 km of trails throughout the valley many of which are wheelchair accessible.

Bird Watch

Over 190 species of birds have been sighted within Wakamow Valley across all seasons of the year. Bird-watching kits can be borrowed free of charge from the Wakamow Valley Authority office.

Camp

Need more time to explore the valley? Make a weekend of it and stay at the River Park Campground. Located along the river, the 60-site campground is open from May to October. For reservations, please call 306-692-2285.

Snowshoe

There are snowshoes for both adults and children to use free of charge from the Wakamow Valley Authority office.

Canoe / Kayak

One of the best ways to explore the valley is from the river itself. The gentle flow of the river makes it suitable for all abilities.

There are four playgrounds in the valley for kids to enjoy, three of which are wheelchair accessible.

The cross-country ski trails are groomed by the City of Moose Jaw and are the perfect way to explore our winter wonderland. Download a map of the cross-country ski trails on our website.

During the winter months, the City of Moose Jaw creates an ice-skating oval at Kiwanis River Park. There is a heated change room available. Just bring your skates!

Kiwanis River Park is in the heart of the valley and is situated along the river, opposite the River Park Campground.

There is ample parking, picnic areas and washrooms which make it popular for large-scale. public events.

The outdoor pavilion and the indoor lodge can be rented separately or together to cover all weather scenarios.

If all these activities have given you an appetite, there are many briquette BBQs throughout the valley. There is also the popular Burger Cabin just across from Rotary Park which is open during the summer months.
